PRODUCTION, QUALITY and INSPECTION RECORDS MINIMUM 10 YEAR RETENTION REQUIREMENT

- 1. Seller shall retain objective evidence of inspections, test results and disposition of non-conforming parts and materials for a minimum of ten (10) years from date of final purchase order payment.
- 2. When applicable, the records shall be traceable to the specific parts, materials, production lot or batch, serial numbers, including heat and lot numbers of raw materials when appropriate.
- 3. Records shall be stored under conditions adequate to maintain the integrity of the documents and provide protection from accidental damage or destruction from fire, wind, water or similar accidental events.
- 4. If the records are maintained electronically, seller shall insure the means to retrieve the information remains available throughout the required retention period.
- 5. Records shall be available for review by Buyer, or authorized representatives of Buyer, on request. Seller may request a reasonable amount of time to retrieve or compile the information.
- 6. Additional retention time, if required, is subject to negotiation between Buyer and Seller.
- 7. Seller shall notify Buyer of any activity (new facility, sale of business etc.) that might impact the record retention status.
